

General Shipping Instructions for US Destined Freight

Suppliers are responsible for contacting Solventum's nominated freight forwarder to schedule the shipment. Solventum's nominated freight forwarder can be identified by referencing the global routing guide on the [Solventum Partners & Suppliers website](#).

Bill of lading instructions

- Use non-negotiable bills of lading
- Consign to the party listed on the Solventum-issued Purchase Order
- Notify party for customs clearance are:

- List Solventum PO #s & full delivery address in marks & numbers.
- Attach a packing list to at least 1 carton.
- Mark each carton "Solventum" followed by PO #, delivery address, & country of origin.
 - Each item must be marked with the country of origin in accordance with US marking regulations.

Required Documents for all US-bound shipments:

Commercial invoice: this must include the full delivery name and address, sold to party name and address, all purchase order number(s), invoice date, and the name and phone number of Solventum contact buying/receiving the shipment. The below must also be included for every line / material in the shipment:

- A detailed description of the merchandise (in English)
- Solventum material ID #
- Harmonized tariff code
- Quantity shipped
- Unit value and total extended value
- Billing Currency
- Manufacturer's Name and Address
- Country of origin

Packing List: this must include shipping carton identification, quantities, and weights

Certificate of Origin (if requested)

Incoterms: Solventum's standard Incoterm is FCA Port of Export. In case of questions please contact your Solventum buyer as any exceptions to FCA must go through an approval process.

Wood Packaging: any imported materials using wood packaging, bracing, crating, or pallets must comply with the International Plant Protection Convention Standard ISPM 15. All wood must be stamped with the IPPC approved mark.

Any costs incurred by Solventum resulting from supplier noncompliance on these points may be charged back to the supplier.

Mandatory US Customs Requirement for Ocean Shipments to US Destinations

All US-bound ocean shipments require additional details to be shared with freight forwarder to complete the US Customs **Importer Security Filing**. Please see content on Solventum's Supplier Direct website for details around this requirement.
